A Message from our Pastor





This is a letter being sent by regular mail to each household in the congregation.

Dear Congregation,

After considerable thought and prayer, I have decided that next year I will retire from pastoral ministry. Amanda and I are looking forward to having more time for our family. Amanda continues to pursue her interests in early childhood mathematics education, and my retirement from church ministry will give her more time to do that. While we remain very grateful that Amanda's prognosis is very good, her recent illness was certainly a "wake-up" call for us to realize that we need to make time for some retirement fun while our health is still good enough for us to enjoy those activities.

Last night at a meeting of the session of the church, I requested that my call as pastor be terminated on Sunday, August 2, of next year (2020). The session, while expressing gracious reluctance, nevertheless agreed to recommend that to the congregation of our church. A special congregational meeting has been called for Sunday, August 18, 2019, immediately following morning worship. In our Presbyterian system, a call is a three-way agreement—among minister, congregation, and the presbytery. Thus, assuming the congregation concurs in my request, we will jointly ask the presbytery for their concurrence, as well.

It may seem unusual for me to announce this a full year in advance of the date of termination. However, I am doing this so that the congregation will be allowed to elect a search committee (technically called a "Pastor Nominating Committee") and to begin searching for your next pastor while I am still here. It seemed to me, and the session agreed, that it would be good to forego having an interim pastor during the time of a search. If all goes according to our plan, your next pastor would be able to begin very shortly after my departure.

God blessed me when you called me to serve Mountain Brook Presbyterian Church. In 2016, I knew I needed to come back to Birmingham to be with my father, but I had no assurance of being able to continue as a pastor. You made it possible for me to do both. I'm proud of the things you have accomplished during my time at the church. Thanks to much hard work and financial support on your part, the facility is beginning to sparkle again—new windows, fresh exterior paint, new lighting throughout, shiny floors, parking-lot sealing and striping, and new HVAC equipment. The stained-glass windows are illuminated every night after sundown, as is the steeple. Roof leaks and sanitary systems have been repaired. The church's internet connections are now fast and reliable, with Wi-Fi available throughout the facility. We have new governing documents, including a certificate of formation, bylaws, and a policy on committees of the church. The church rolls have been updated, and a new cloud-based church information system is in place. In just a few more weeks, we hope to begin testing a system for receiving online and texted contributions to the church.

Indeed, our infrastructure is at a point where I think it makes sense for us to begin targeted communications to our neighborhood, letting them (and especially persons new to the neighborhood) know what a great church is in their back yard. I hope that in the next year we can welcome some new families to our congregation, giving your next pastor a great foundation on which to continue building.

So, this is not really good-bye. We have another whole year ahead of us to love God and one another—together. Thank you for three years of great ministry together. Let's make this fourth one count!

Minutes of the Session Meeting Mountain Brook Presbyterian Church June 9, 2019

Rev. Lant Davis, moderator, called the regular meeting of the Mountain Brook Presbyterian Church Session to order on Sunday, June 9, 2019 at 5:00 p.m. in the church library with a quorum present. Dick Trueb offered the opening devotional and prayer.

Elders present were Jill Bonatz, Dick Trueb, David Kaiser, Erskine Carmichael, Alex Wellman, Norton Montague, Alan Speaker, and Karen Ogle. Carroll Barrett was absent and excused.

The agenda was accepted as presented.

Clerk's Report

The minutes of the May 19, 2019 meeting were approved.

Jill Bonatz will have the devotional and opening prayer for the July meeting. It is uncertain at this time who will participate with Rev. Davis in home communion on July 10, 2019.

There was no correspondence for the session to review.

Ministry Team Reports

Finance Committee

The reimbursement from the Birmingham Water Works due to our water leak is a greater amount than we expected it to be, but that amount has not yet been received.

On motion duly made and passed, the financial report for the month ending May 31, 2019 was received.

Personnel Committee

Alan speaker has prepared a draft of a position description for a part-time maintenance worker. The subcommittee, which consists of Dick Trueb, Alan Speaker, and Rev. Davis, will look into this.

Christian Education Committee

Bible Times on Brookwood has been postponed until August 4 - 7, 2019, in the evening. Revised flyers and registration forms are available in the narthex. Spenser Bissell has been a great help with the bible school and other areas of christian education. He has been given a copy of the church child protection policy. Rally Day is September 8, 2019 and all church programs will resume at that time. The advent lunch, which was a big success last year, is slated for December 8, 2019. MBPC will hold a confirmation class this year, with the class members being presented on Easter Sunday.

Property Committee

The Property Committee met on June 6, 2019. Discussion was held regarding the York HVAC system in the Fellowship Hall. Central Heating & Cooling proposes to replace the unit for \$19,565. Hardy Services proposed looking at the unit for possible leaks or repairs to parts. Hardy Services also has the accounts of Canterbury UMC, Mountain Brook Baptist Church, and a number of other churches.

Harold Faught is working on bringing the steeple lighting project to a conclusion.

A proposal was received from YESCO to replace with LED lighting the exterior area lighting (gable of kitchen and standard in parking lot near the sanctuary). That amount is \$790. There is no money for that in the maintenance budget, so on motion duly made and passed, the amount will be charged to the Major Capital Repairs budget (#8128).

The parking lot sealing and striping project has been completed and payment was made through the Special Church Support Fund.

The 2018 "Tree Fall" project has been completed and will be reimbursed from insurance, except for the \$1000 deductible.

There was discussion regarding the care of the exterior of our stained glass windows, the replacement value of which is \$1,787,000. Willet Hauser proposes (1) to use a ¼" acrylic covering at a cost of \$193,413, or (2) a ½" double-pane, insulated tempered glass at a cost of \$236,970. While the acrylic covering is less expensive, the double-pane, insulated tempered glass will make up the difference in energy costs over the next ten years, is washable, and will offer a better appearance over time. Rev. Davis will contact Riverchase Methodist Church, which has used this company to repair their existing windows. Methods to pay for this project include a capital campaign, securing a loan from Willet Hauser, or securing a loan from the Presbyterian Investment and Loan Program. The question was brought up about possibly replacing the carpet in the sanctuary along with the window project. The Property Committee will go to the Finance Committee for advice on how best to pay for this should the church decide to move forward.

Bids are also being taken to replace the church office copier. That lease will expire in August, 2019. The capital lease will require session approval. The office secretary's computer is beginning to show age, but we will wait and see on that.

Worship Committee

There is no news from the Worship Committee. Communion was served on June 2, 2019, and the extended communion will be served on June 12, 2019. Rev. Davis and Drew Spransy will provide this.

Mission and Outreach

The Dannon Project is finished and was well received. Alan Speaker and Rev. Davis traveled to Serve You Ministries in Eastlake and were impressed with what they saw. If we decide to support it, this mission would serve as a referral source for our church. There is a lot of potential here. Mission and Outreach will help the church determine our part, whether it be working in the food market, interviewing clients, or greeting clients upon their arrival.

Welcome Committee

The Welcome Committee is always watching for visitors to our church. Plans are being made for their next meeting.

Congregational Care

We need to remember to keep our caterer informed regarding our church Wednesday night schedule.

Preschool

The summer programs have started. New child-proof latches have been placed on the gates.

Moderator's Report

Rev. Davis is thrilled to announce that Amanda is doing great! It is time to elect new officers for the church. Congregational Care and Personnel committees will need new liaisons to the session. Jill Bonatz will serve as liaison for the Worship Committee, and Norton Montague will serve as liaison for the Finance Committee. Alex Wellman has agreed to sign checks for the church. He lives closer to the church and his service is much appreciated. All 2019 church officers have agreed to serve for another year. We will vote on these positions next month.

There being no further business, Rev. Davis adjourned the meeting with prayer.
