A Message from our Pastor





And David said to Solomon his son, Be strong and of good courage, and do it: fear not, nor be dismayed: for the Lord God, even my God, will be with thee; he will not fail thee, nor forsake thee, until thou hast finished all the work for the service of the house of the Lord. 1 Chronicles 28:20 (KJV)

The books of Chronicles in the Old Testament cover the history of Israel beginning with the United Kingdom under Saul (around 1000 BCE) and ending with the Edict of Cyrus the Persian (538 BCE), which allowed the exiled residents of Judah to return to their homeland. Generally thought to have been written after the Exile, it covers much of the same history that we find in the books of Samuel and Kings. Because it is more of a secondary source, it does not appear in the lectionary of Sunday readings as often as those other books. Even so, it has some passages that are unforgettable.

The passage quoted above is one of my favorites. It comes from a longer setting in which King David is telling the people that he has made ample provision for the building of the Temple and even has received plans from God for how the Temple should be constructed. Yet he acknowledges God's command that David's son Solomon should be the king who actually constructs the building. Solomon is young and inexperienced and, presumably, is daunted by the task of erecting the Temple, the long-foretold place of awe, where God would meet his people. Addressing Solomon's misgivings, David then offers the advice that is quoted above: "Be strong and of good courage; fear not, nor be dismayed: for the LORD God will be with you."

As the year 2020 breaks upon us, we all have things that we plan to accomplish. Some of them may be daunting. Our church has some important work ahead in 2020, so collectively we need hope and courage. Individually, too, we want to grow in our discipleship. That process, called "sanctification" by the theologians, is rarely easy. Becoming better disciples of Jesus often involves freeing ourselves of attachments to things, ideas, and even relationships that weigh us down on our Kingdom road. Letting go of our attachments is hard work. Withdrawal can be painful, as increasingly we learn to put God first in our priorities.

Just when we begin to wonder if we can do it, we hear King David's advice in Scripture. Anticipating by centuries the exclamations of the Christmas angels, he exhorts us, "Fear not!" We are not alone in our efforts, for God's grace supports us throughout. God will not fail us, nor forsake us, until our work is finished. Thus, we can be strong and of good courage as we take on the new year.

I pray that your New Year is happy and that all of us will continue to experience God's grace in our lives. Amanda joins me in thanking you, for us and for the whole church staff, for your kindnesses shown to us during the Christmas season. We are blessed to serve Mountain Brook Presbyterian Church.

2020-2021 Preschool Registration

Registration for the 2020-2021 school year is just around the corner!

Registration for current preschool families & MBPC church members with children ages 3 months to five years old by September 1, 2020 begins

January 8th at 6:00am.

Forms will be time-stamped and accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis. The registration fee must be submitted within 24 hours of confirmation from the preschool office, confirming availability, either by dropping off cash or check to the preschool office, or by paying with your SmartCare app or with Paypal.

Registration fees are waived for church members.

Registration for families currently on our Waiting List opens at 6:00am January 10th.

Open registration for all children ages 3 months to five years old by September 1, 2020 begins January 14th.
